When you want to count to any number between 1 and 100, you can add the two numbers together by connecting them with و wa which means and: two and twenty to make 22: تنين وعشرين. Or eight and fifty to make 58: تمانة وخمسين. Or even a hundred and nine and ninety to make 199: إمية وتسعة وتسعين! And just like that, with a little bit of math, you can count up to 199 in Arabic! Remember to put the ones place, then و , then the tens to start counting!
