Level 1 - Lesson 8 : Question Words: What : شو

As you grow your vocabulary in Arabic you want to ask what is this? In Arabic you can say شو هاد shoo had assuming the object is masculine. You can also say شو هاي shoo hay if you know the object is feminine.

*In MSA this phrase is: ما هذه or ما هذا

This lesson, although it is short, is very useful in acquiring new language constantly. Ask your friend شو هاد?

You can combine this with other vocabulary we have already learned. You can put شو before بدّك to ask someone what they want. Or شو بدها which means 'what does she want' and mix and match them to see what everyone wants.

BONUS: You could hear ثورو or شو؟؟ نعم؟؟ as an exaggerated 'whaaat' when someone is in disbelief. Try it... it's lots of fun to say. The longer the شورورور the more confused someone is.

Sample dialogues:

A - شو بدّك؟ Shoo biddak? What do you want?

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B - بدّي تفاحة.
Biddee tufaha.
I want an apple.
A - شو ها <i>ي</i> ؟
Shoo hay?
What's this?
B - هاي مقلوبة.
Hay maqloobeh
This is maqloobeh (upside down rice dish).
