Level 1 - Lesson 4 : I He She We You They 🙏 أنا هو هي نحن أنت هم

This is the first official introduction of the subject pronouns. Instead of saying the person's name you are talking about you can use pronouns to shorten your sentences and sound more natural.

It's also the first lesson where we compare Modern Standard Arabic (MSA) to spoken Levantine Arabic. Let's start with the MSA pronouns:

```
ana - I - أنا
```

huwwa - He - هو

هي - She هي -

nahnu - We - نحن

anta - You male - أنتَ

anti - You female - أنتِ

antumaa - You dual - أنتما

antum - You plural co-ed group - أنتم

antunn - You plural all female group - أنتنّ

huma - Them dual - لمها

hum - Them co-ed group - هم

الس - Them all female group - فنّ

Do not be nervous! It is so much easier in Levantine Arabic. Here are the pronouns in Levantine Arabic and how the pronunciation differs:

```
ana - I - أنا

huwweh - He - هو

المو heyyeh - She - هي

المنت - nihna - We

نحن - inte - You male

أنت - You female

أنت - You female

أنت - hummeh - Them
```

In Levantine Arabic we have less pronouns for 'you' and it makes it easier! The difference between A and is is that A is used more in Jordan and Palestine whereas is used more in Syria and Lebanon.

Another thing you might see is that انت is sometimes written as to emphasize that I am talking to you, a girl. This is especially used in casual settings like social media or text messages.
